

All the News from Second Grade

October 2018

Dear Families:

Happy October! We are thankful to have a great autumn season ahead of us. We are looking forward to a special activity about our community, beginning Reconciliation training, and several other great happenings this month.

In language arts, we are working hard in Daily 5. The children know about the 5 ways to become a better reader: read to self, read to someone, work on writing, word work, and listen to reading. We are practicing and reinforcing the Fry's high frequency words in class. Our goal is to become more fluent and confident readers this year. Please make the time to practice reading aloud or independently at home each night.

During October we continue the life science chapters which include units about living and nonliving things (plants and animals), and environments. We will also begin learning about conservation, and how to take care of the Earth. Most of our curricular areas will be integrated as we study conservation and God's Creation. Our wrap up activity will be writing reports about animals and habitats in Minnesota.

We have studied bus safety in social studies, and we have been exploring our textbook. Our first unit involves learning about environments, habitats, conservation, natural resources, and landforms. The children are learning the concept of caring for the Earth's natural resources: land, water, air, animals, and plants. We will explore different ways children can conserve and protect them. We will also learn about consumers and producers. We will "meet" and learn about Cesar Chavez and Rachel Carson who were influential in conservation. During October we will review Fire Safety. Do you know your family fire escape plan?

We are strongly into our second math unit this month. The unit is called "Addition and Subtraction Facts." The children will use their knowledge of the basic addition and subtraction facts to solve number stories involving real-life situations. At the beginning of our school year, the children are refreshed on what they learned last year in mathematics. We are establishing daily routines that will be used all year to promote an active and cooperative learning environment. Be alert to the "Home Link" pages that will be sent home for lesson support. The Home Links need to be completed at home, and returned to school the following day since these are graded assignments. Thank you.

Our religion lessons are revolving around the theme "Revelation" from our text book titled Call to Faith. During this time, we are learning about God's Creation, God's Promise, and God's Word. We are also learning and strengthening our prayers each day. Please practice and pray with your child each day. Prayer is a special time you can share with each other as an opportunity for either one-on-one time or family time.

In art we have been learning about line, primary and secondary colors, and color mixing. We have made a few crafts to decorate our classrooms as well. Our art lessons come from the program called "Arts Attack."

We are learning and working each day with VoWac and spelling skills. We will learn how to apply them to our daily writing. A note concerning both of these subjects has been sent home to keep you informed of our studies and also to help you reinforce what your child is learning at school.

Mrs. Fischer and Miss Deason are sending copies of our daily schedules this week. It is followed quite closely, but there is always flexibility depending upon the school activities in which we are involved. The schedule is for you to post at home to help in planning appointments or other family related happenings.

The volunteer sign-up sheet for our classrooms has been sent home. We will put together a schedule of helpers each month. Remember that Virtus training is required for all volunteers. Thank you.

Thanks to those of you who donated books to our classroom from the Book Fair. We are truly enjoying each one as we read and use them. We appreciate your kindness.

Enjoy the wonderful autumn happenings with your family.
