Important Information

A reminder that students will need to wear their Red Sacred Heart School t-shirt, black pants, and black shoes for the program. Detailed information will be sent with t-shirts explaining the schedule for that evening when shirts arrive.

CAROLING...Sacred Heart School will visit Lakeshore Inn Nursing Home on Wednesday, December 4, at 10:00 a.m. to spread some Christmas cheer. They will perform songs from our school Christmas program, *C.A.K.E.* for the residents at the Nursing Home.

ADVENT...During the Advent Season the teachers and children of Sacred Heart School will participate in four Advent Prayer services. We will hold them on December 2, 9, 16, at 8:15 a.m. and December 19, at 12:30 p.m. in the school foyer.

PARENTS VISITING FOR LUNCH...A reminder that parents are welcome to join their child/ren for lunch during the school year. However, please contact the school office by 9:00 a.m. so we can include you in the lunch count for that day. In order to comply with federal lunch regulations, food from outside vendors or fast food restaurants are not permitted. Students in Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grade have lunch daily at approximately 11:15 a.m. Students in 3rd and 4th grade have lunch daily at approximately 11:15 a.m. Students in 3rd and 4th grade have lunch daily at approximately 11:30 a.m. <u>A reminder that all visitors must report to the school office to check in and secure a visitor's pass.</u>

Seasonal Influenza Guidelines

You can help us prevent the spread of influenza at school by taking the following important steps:

- Keep your child home if they have symptoms of the flu. That means a fever of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or greater, with cough and/or a sore throat. You should check your child for these symptoms each morning before sending them to school. Students who have these symptoms at school will be sent home. Other symptoms that may occur with the influenza include runny nose, headache, body aches, vomiting and diarrhea (in addition to fever and cough or sore throat).
- Sick children must stay home for at least 24 hours after their fever is gone without use of fever-reducing drugs like Tylenol or Motrin. Children should not come back to school if they are not well enough to participate in school activities, even if their fever has been gone for 24 hours. Children staying home with flu symptoms should also avoid contact with others except to get medical care. This includes staying away from afterschool and other activities. Do not use aspirin or aspirin-containing products when your child has influenza symptoms.
- Teach your child to clean their hands often, with soap and water or alcohol-based hands rub. We will remind them to clean their hands regularly during the school day.
- **Teach your child to cover coughs and sneezes.** They should use a tissue when one is available, but they can also cough or sneeze into an elbow or arm. Hands should not be used to cover a cough or sneeze.
- **Teach your child to avoid sharing personal items.** That includes items like drinks, food, or eating utensils.

COLD WEATHER...Please dress your child/ren with appropriate winter clothing every day. Children should come dressed daily with snowpants, jackets, hat, mittens, and boots. We do play outside every day except when the actual temperature and or wind-chill are below zero degrees.

SCHOOL CLOSING...In the event of severe winter weather, we follow the same schedule as the Waseca Public Schools. Please follow the directions given by the superintendent of Waseca Public Schools, and **School Messenger** Instant Parent Contact Program. You may also listen to WCCO, KOWO/STAR 92.1, and KEEZ radio. You may also view school closures on WCCO, KSTP, and KARE TV stations. SCHOOL MESSANGER INSTANT CONTACT PROGRAM...Our school utilizes the School Messenger system to deliver text messages, straight to you mobile phone with important information about events, school closings, safety alerts and more. You can participate in this free service just by sending a text message of "Y" or "YES" to our school's short code number, 67587. You can also opt out of these messages at any time by simply replying to one of our messages with "Stop". School Messenger is compliant with the Student Privacy Pledge, so you can rest assured that your information is safe and will never be given or sold to anyone. Opt-In from your mobile phone now!
