School Supplies/Technology Fee

Student supplies for the classroom were ordered by the office. The only items you will need to purchase for the first day of school are tennis shoes and a backpack. You will receive the cost for the supplies in your family folder. This fee can be paid the first week of school. The supply fee for students will be \$25. We hope you find this a convenient alternative to finding the necessary materials yourself.

We will need to begin charging a technology fee this school year. The fee will be \$50 per family. This fee will cover management of devices purchased for students at Sacred Heart School.

Sacred Heart School Dress Code

1. Children should be dressed in clean, modest, weather appropriate clothing.

2. Students should not wear pants with holes in them.

3. Children should not wear short skirts, short shorts, halter tops, tube tops, midriff tops, and tops with spaghetti straps, see through mesh shirts, or muscle shirts that expose the upper torso.

4. T-shirts with offensive messages are not appropriate.

5. Belly buttons should not be showing.

6. No spike jewelry.

7. Children should not wear hats in the school building.

8. Students must wear socks and shoes/sandals that cover or strap around the entire foot. Sandals that slip on without straps, flip-flops, clogs, etc. will not be permitted. Consider heel height when purchasing shoes for children. Tennis shoes are always best for school.

9. Non-skid tennis shoes are required for physical education and playground activities.

10. Parents should make sure to use particular discretion when children will be attending Mass or performing in school programs.

All students must wear masks to school each day during the COVID-19 pandemic.

School Lunch Program

Lunch prices for the 2020-2021 school year will be: students \$2.95, adults \$3.95, and milk for cold lunches will be 50 cents. We encourage families to read the information on free and reduced lunches for students found in the family folder you will receive at the Parent Meeting on Wednesday, August 26, at 7:00 p.m. Sacred Heart School receives federal and state funding for our school based on the number of free and reduced lunches served during the school year. Families who qualify for free/reduced lunches is confidential information. We encourage you to deposit money into your child/ren's lunch account the first week of school. We use the "offer vs. serve" plan in our school lunch program. As many as six items may be offered, but a student needs only to select three items. We highly encourage the students to eat the three items they select. Students will have two lunch choices each day. The choices consist of a hot lunch and an alternate lunch. You will find the specific food items offered for the two choices on the monthly lunch menus. By providing a choice we hope students will eat school lunch. Our school earns federal dollars for the lunch program based on our student lunch count each month. With the implementation of our new wellness policy, students will always have the choice of hot vegetables or fresh vegetables each day. We will also provide fresh fruit as often as possible.
